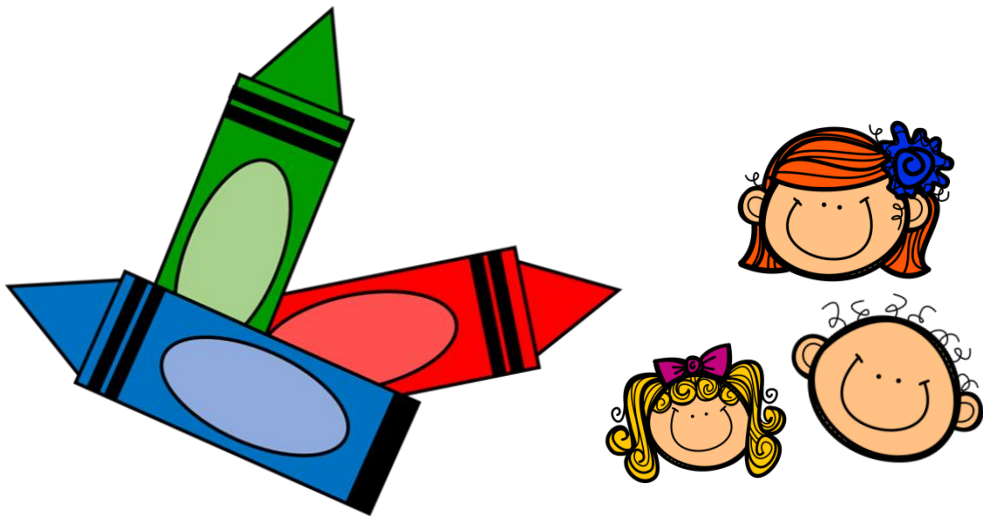

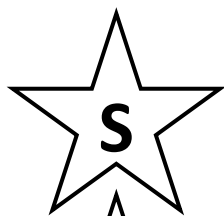

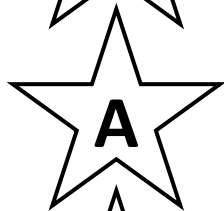
Exercise 1**Acrostic Poem**

Write an acrostic poem with the letters that form your name. Tell us about yourself through the poem!

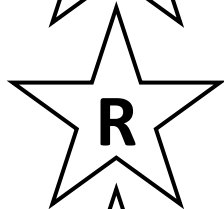
